Rotary International President Message

To adapt, as laid out in Rotary's Action Plan, we must occasionally step out of our comfort zone and try something new. Here are two examples of clubs that adapted — one with heart and one through critical thinking and strategy.

The Rotary Club of Chandigarh Mid Town, India, led with heart earlier this year. To engage members and grow membership, Club President Nitin Kapur personally called every former member of the club and invited them to a gathering billed as an alumni meetup.

Eight former members attended, and the results were stupendous. The visitors had a chance to connect once more — not only with current members but with the sense of camaraderie and belonging that membership gave them. By the end of the evening, the club welcomed six of the former members back into the Rotary family.

Club President Kapur showed courage when he reached out to the alumni. Not only did he adapt and try something new but he had the strength of character to show the club's alumni how much they still meant to the family of Rotary. That bravery paid off.

People want to feel needed and appreciated. People want to feel that they belong. And they might never feel that way if we don't have the courage to tell them.

Meanwhile, the Rotary Club of Seoul-Hansoo, Korea, has been experimenting with different club models to great effect. Over the past four years, Seoul-Hansoo has created and maintained four satellite clubs — a service club, an interest-based club for musicians, a cause-based club that mentors professionals, and a club for college students.

These satellite clubs are part of a five-year plan the Seoul-Hansoo club implemented to increase membership through innovation.

What's the secret to founding and maintaining so many satellite clubs? Membership between Seoul-Hansoo and its satellite clubs is fluid and synergistic. Many members of the satellite clubs attend the sponsor club's meetings. And many of the sponsor club's members participate in the satellite clubs.

Additionally, the focus of each satellite club is no accident. Each one appeals to different interests of people in the sponsor club and in the community, attracting existing and potential members. This is an excellent strategy to both retain and attract members because it offers flexibility. If someone is interested in joining but they can't make it to the sponsor club's meetings, they have plenty of options to choose from.

These are just two examples of how we can adapt with our hearts and minds. Every club is different, so I encourage you to reach out to members of your club and of the community around you. Ask them about the club experience and what you can do to improve.

Talk to enough people and you might find ways that you can adapt and spark The Magic of Rotary in your club.

District Secretary's Message

We are in the final month of Calendar Year 2024 in which we celebrate Disease Prevention and Treatment Month. On focus are on various initiatives, projects and activities which we do as Rotarians to prevent and/or fight disease. This celebration is important because as the saying goes, "Health is wealth."

In this edition, I will reiterate the message of Mr. Thomas Woods, Data Relations Manager, Data Services, Rotary International (RI), addressed to all current and incoming Rotary and Rotaract Club officers, copy furnished the Governors, assistant governors, district executive secretaries, District Rotaract Representatives, and District Rotaract Chairs, regarding the need to confirm some club information in the Rotary database in preparation for the January 2025 club invoices.

Specifically, the reminder is for clubs to confirm their club membership and officers' information in Rotary's database by 1 January 2025 as the data will be used by RI to generate the January 2025 clubs' invoices.

It is important that your club's member information is up to date because Rotary cannot change the club invoice after it has been generated or accept membership updates with your payment.

Indeed, as current club officers, we can ensure that our club's invoice will be correct by checking the accuracy of the information in Rotary's database. Here is how:

- 1. Sign in to <u>My Rotary</u> and click on View Club on your club's tile on the homepage. From there, select Members. Rotary Club officers can download a member list under Members to compare the data in RI's database to the information in My Rotary to make sure that it is accurate as the invoice will be generated based on the information on this list. This function is currently only available to Rotary clubs.
- 2. Report all new or terminated members and RY 2024-2025 club officers, including those that are still serving in their roles from the previous Rotary year, no later than 1 January 2025.

Please take note that members with admission dates of 1 January 2025 or before will be counted for the January 2025 club invoice. On the other hand, members with termination dates of 1 January 2025 or before will not be counted for the January 2025 club invoice. Be guided also that incoming club officers can view data in <u>My Rotary</u>, but they cannot make any changes.

In addition, any changes to subscriptions to Rotary International's official magazine Rotary [in English] should be reported to <u>data@rotary.org</u> prior to 1 January 2025.

Memorandum to All Rotary Clubs thru their respective Irresistible Presidents

Re: Notification on the Selection of District Governor Nominee for RY2027-

Please be advised that pursuant to the Report of the 2024 District Nominating Committee dated November 30, 2024, and the authority vested upon me as District Governor under the Latest Amended Terms of Reference, I hereby report that the lone candidate PP Sherrylou O. Khosiking from the Rotary Club of San Juan Del Monte has been unanimously voted by all the members of the 2024 DNC as the District Governor Nominee (DGN) of D2800 for PV 2027 28 D3800 for RY 2027-28.

Under the Amended TOR, since there is only one candidate, the period of challenge is no longer applicable, and as such, PP Sherrylou O. Khosiking is hereby declared as the Official DGN of D3800 for RY 2027-28 effective immediately. Her Picture and Bio-Data shall be published at the next Governor's Monthly Newsletter and her DGN Nomination Form shall be sent to Rotary International.

Memorandum to all Irresistible Club Presidents

Re: ELECTION GUIDELINES FOR DGN RY 2026-27

- Pursuant to the Decision of the Rotary International Board in its October 2024 Possibility of the Control of the Co governor of District 3800.
- The conduct of the club ballot shall be in accordance with Article III sub-paragraph G of the Amended Terms of Reference of D3800. For easy reference, the following are the provisions applicable:
 - G. CONTEST OF SELECTION PROCEDURES

Notwithstanding any selection made by the District Nominating Committee, any club in the District may propose a candidate for District Governor Nominee subject to the following guidelines:

- 1. Only candidates for the District Governor Nominee whose names had previously been duly suggested to the Nominating Committee shall be eligible for re-nomination.

 2. All re-nominations should be covered by a new resolution of the nominating club certified by the Club President and Secretary.

 3. The formal acceptance by the re-nominated candidates is necessary by way of a letter signed by said re-nominated candidate.

 4. The resolution for the re-nomination of any candidate to be valid must have the endorsement of at least five (5) other clubs in good standing in the district as of July 1° of the Rotary Year, or twenty percent (20%) of the total number of clubs as of the beginning of the same Rotary Year, whichever is higher, in addition to that of the nominating duly. No club shall re-nominate and/or endorse more than one candidate Year, whichever is nigher, in addition to train of the hominating club. No club shall re-nominate and/or endorse more than one candidate and said re-nomination must be supported by a club resolution adopted at a regular meeting of the club and certified by the club President and Secretary.

 The names, personal qualifications, and bio-data of all re-nominated candidates including that of the candidate chosen by the Nominating Committee shall be immediately circulated to all Club Presidents by the Incumbant District Covernor.

 Thereafter, selection shall be by balloting in a ballot by mail (now e-voling) by all Clubs in the District within the confines of a definition of a club in good standing with Rotary International.

 6.1 Voting strength, for purposes of ballot by mail shall be based on the club invoice dated July 1 of the year prior to the year the club ballot takes place or the July invoice of the year in which the club ballot takes place or the July invoice of the year in which the club ballot takes place whichever is lower. If a club is entitled to more than one vote, the club shall cast all votes for the same candidate. (Source: Rotary Code of Policies Subsection 2.130.3)
- Club Voting Eligibilities (reference: Amended and Latest TOR, RI Bylaws 12.020. Procedure to Select Governor and Rotary Code of Policies 2.130.4 District Election Pilot)

A Rotary Club can participate in the DGN Election RY 2026-27, if all the conditions below have been met on/or before November 25, 2024:

- District dues for RY 2024-25 have been paid as of November 25, 2024:
- RI Dues have been paid for the first semester RY 2024-25 as of November 25, 2024; November 25, 2024;
- 3. Chartered or reinstated before January 2024

Timeline/Schedule and Procedures

- The Club President is the sole/only recipient of emails coming from RI's E-voting platform and shall be the one responsible in casting the vote.
- Only one candidate can be voted by an eligible club.
 The club's voting strength is determined by the formula in RI Bylaws section 15.050.1, Electors. "A club with more than 25 members has one additional vote for each

additional 25 members or major fraction thereof. That is, a club with a membership of up to 37 members is entitled to one vote, a club with 38 to 62 members is entitled to two votes, a club with 63 to 87 members is entitled to three votes and so on. Membership is determined by the number of members in the latest club invoice before the vote, except that a suspended club has no vote. If a club is entitled to more than one vote, the club shall cast all votes for the same candidate. (source: RI Bylaws 12.050.1, Club Voting)

- Pursuant to the Memorandum issued by District Governor Roberto Zamora addressed to the two candidates dated October 30, 2024, both candidates were directed to reproduce the same Bio-data submitted to the 2023 DNC for distribution to the 107 Rotary clubs including the soft copy to be saved in a clearly marked usb during the Breakfast Meeting on November 9, 2024. Rotarian Celso Montalla complied with the directive. However, Rotarian Jerry Ang submitted a new Bio-Data consisting of three (3) pages without any soft copy which copy was different with the one submitted to the DNC. Rotarian Jerry Ang was again directed to submit the same DNC copy but he refused on the ground that the Bio-data submitted to the DNC was meant for the DNC alone and not to the rotary clubs and he considers it a breach of data privacy if the district will reproduce and submit the same DNC Bio-data to the 107 Rotary Clubs. For purposes of the distribution of the required Bio-data under the Amended Terms of Reference Article III Sub par G no. 5, Rotarian Jerry Ang is hereby allowed to use his new Bio-data already distributed to the 107 Rotary Clubs last November 9, 2024 without prejudice to any issue to be raised on the new Bio-data. The Club President is mandated and shall be responsible to send to all
- the members of his or her club in good standing the soft copies of the bio-data submitted by the two candidates during the Breakfast Meeting
- last November 9, 2024 prior to the voting period.
 Upon receipt of the advice from Rotary International South Pacific and Philippines Office (RISPPO) as to the date of opening of voting portal of US Based provider Simply Voting, all eligible clubs have fifteen (15) days to conduct the club vote and within which to enter their club vote at the voting portal. The voting period shall be for a period of fifteen (15) days which will start on January 7, 2025 and shall end on January 22, 2025 at 5:00pm (Manila time). During the voting period, the Club President shall conduct the club vote between PP Jerry Ang (Valenzuela Sunrise) and PP Celso Montalla (Marikina Hilltop) (Annex B- Simply Voting Sample Ballot)
- At the end of the voting period, RISPPO shall communicate to the District Governor the results of the election who in turn shall immediately bisinct Governor the results of the election who in turn shall immediately announce to the candidates and all the Rotary Clubs within a period of twenty four (24) hours from notification by RISPPO.

Please don't provide access to either your e-mail address or the e-voting link (when elections will start) to any other individual under any circumstances. This can be considered a serious breach of trust.

- the responsibility of preserving the passwords lies solely on the President and or no circumstances will any communication be taken into cognizance about sisuse/hacking of the same.
- E-voting links will be provided only to club presidents, and it is strongly recommended that casting of voter's should be done in the presence of Secretary/Club Officer/Club Assembly/Club Board. This will ensure transparency and will also help in avoiding any allegations against the President about the
- E-mail communications about complaints on the election process shot preferably not be sent to Rotary leaders' viz. RI President, General Socreta Board of Directors, as this spoits the repetation of your district/country and negat the great humanitarian efforts being put-in by Rotarians.

We would like to remind everyone that announcements, guidelines, reminders, and related information that come from the Office of the District Governor are the only valid and official communications with regards to this election. The DQN Election Guidelines have been reviewed and approved by RI (Please see attached Annax A) and are only applicable to our district. Circulating documents periment to the election that are no approved and/or released by the Office of the District Governor is strictly prohibited and henceforth, shall be tantamount to Campaigning, Canvassing, and Electioneering (refe to Article 13.010 of RI Bylaws and Amended Latest TOR) and will be regarded as ground:
