This month, as we come together for the International Assembly and the Presidential Peace Conference, we celebrate The Magic of Rotary — a unique blend of global connection, vision, and action that empowers us to create lasting change.

One of the most inspiring examples is our Rotary Peace Fellowship program, a cornerstone of Rotary's mission to build a more peaceful and just world. For more than 23 years, Rotary Peace Fellowships have been transforming communities. Our Rotary Peace Centers, hosted at leading universities around the globe, have educated over 1,800 fellows who now work in more than 140 countries.

These centers cultivate expertise in fields like conflict resolution, sustainable development, and peacebuilding, preparing fellows to tackle some of the world's most pressing challenges. This program exemplifies how Rotary turns vision into action, creating a ripple effect of hope and change.

This month during the Presidential Peace Conference, we celebrate a significant milestone with the opening of our newest peace center in Istanbul. This center will focus on training leaders to address peacebuilding challenges in the Middle East and North Africa, further extending Rotary's impact. Peace fellows are dedicated champions of transformation, addressing critical issues such as refugee resettlement, youth and women's empowerment, and reconciliation in conflict zones. Many founded vital organizations hold leadership roles in governments, nongovernmental organizations, and international institutions like the United Nations and World Bank.

One inspiring story is that of Ntang Julius Meleng, a 2024 Rotary Peace Fellow at Makerere University in Uganda. Through his Social Change Initiative, Julius has worked to empower young people in Cameroon to take active roles in peacebuilding and leadership. His project provided training in conflict prevention, civic engagement, and leadership to youths and community officials in areas affected by conflict, equipping people to drive sustainable peace efforts. Julius harnessed Rotary's global network to overcome obstacles, including limited funding and security risks, and make a meaningful impact.

The Rotary Peace Fellowship gave Julius the tools and support to turn his vision into reality. His work embodies The Magic of Rotary — the transformative power of connecting people, sharing resources, and uniting for a common purpose.

As we reflect on the achievements of our peace fellows and celebrate Rotary's enduring commitment to peace, let us also recognize the role that everyone in our network of 1.2 million members plays in creating magic through service.

Together, we can amplify our impact, inspire new generations of leaders, and build a brighter, more peaceful future.

I assure you, with RC Wack Wack as our host club, and as supported by the EXECOM, led by my husband, Governor Roberto "Bobby" Zamora, you will not regret registering and participating in that event. Indeed, expect only the best and the finest the RID 3800 way!

By the way, the early bird promo is still up until 28 February 2025 only at Php6,800.00 per Rotarian or Spouses/Partner. After which, the regular rates of Php7,500.00 per Rotarian and Php7,000.00 per Spouse/Partner shall apply until 27 March 2025. For payment reference/details, please check my column last edition.

On the prescribed attire during the first day (28 March 2025) of the 2025 DISCON, all male Irresistible Presidents, District Officers and their spouses/partners should come in black suit, black pants, white inner long sleeves and theme tie while the ladies are expected to wear black blazer, black pants, white inner blouse and theme scarf. For the other Rotarians, spouses and guests, they may come in business attire. During the Governor's Ball, gentlemen should wear barong and black pants while ladies should be in Filipiniana.

For Day 2 (29 March 2025), all male Irresistible Presidents, District Officers and their spouses/partners should come in theme barong uniform and black pants while Lady Rotarians should don their theme barong with black pants as well. In the case of the Spouses/partners, the prescribed attire is red blouse uniform and black pants. For the other Rotarians, spouses and guests, the attire is Barong Tagalog for gentlemen and casual Filipiniana for ladies.





Entry Specifications/ Guidelines:

- B. Collage of pictures is not allow
- C. Entry Photo should be posted securely on the BLACK side of 20 $^{\circ}$ x 30 $^{\circ}$ illustration board before bringing them to the venue. See sample.
- D. Size of photo entry is 16" x 20" and in LANDSCAPE orientation.
- E. Entries should be printed in COLORED.
- G. An entry must be an ACTION PICTURE depicting one of the Seven Causes of Rotary

- Peacebuilding and conflict prevention

 Disease prevention and treatment
 Water, sanitation, and hygiene
 Maternal and child health
 Basic education and literacy
 Community economic development
 Supporting the environment





Highly recommend to follow the People of Action style and me

- The image represents genuine, unstaged moments of Rotarians at work a natural and engaging
- · It shows a clear visual narrative
- · Subjects' faces and actions should be positive, happy and engaging.
- If the project has beneficiaries' on-site, images of Rotarians interacting with the beneficiaries that represent the work of the project should be captured.

- j. Name plate of the Rotary club will be provided by the organizer.
- k. Entries will be posted on panels positioned near the area where the DISCON activities will be held
- I. Entries that deviate from the above specifications/guidelines will be disqualified.





B. CRITERIA FOR JUDGING PHOTO EXHIBIT:

a. Content - 50%

- Emphasis will be on the 7 Causes.
 An Action Picture should tell the Rotary story.

b. Visual Presentation - 20%

- Use only photo paper for the pictures.
 Size of Picture: 16" x 20"
- Use of any kind of electrical gadgets or appliances is not allowed.
 Follows the People of Action style and mood requirements.

c. Impact - 30%

- Appeal of the photo exhibit, touches their heart
 Clarity of the Cause in the photos one can identify the Cause being depicted in the photo
 Exemplary concepts in the presentation something that inspires and motivates the viewer
- C. DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSION:

a. Rotary Clubs must signify their intention to join on or before March 17, 2025 by posting the following message at the RI D 3800 DISCON 2025 Photo Contest viber group:

"RC <name of Rotary Club> intends to join the DISCON Photo Exhibit." Sequential posting will be implemented. FIRST COME, FIRST POSTED BASIS.

b. Submission of Entries will be at the DISCON venue on March 28, 2025 strictly from 7:00am to 8:30a

Location of your club's photo entry will depend on time of submission.

- c. You should be the one to paste your entry in your chosen panel location. Organizer will provide doub
- c. You may get back your photos after the Talent Night presentation. The Photo Exhibit organizer will no keep your photo for you.
